The webinar elaborated on the aspects of productive parenting skills and highlighted the partnership role of parents in educating their children in all facets of learning, even outside of academic education.


The webinar covered the following areas:-








concluded with the sharing of the Mindspark workplan for the months of September and October.


The Mathematics Department further encourages all students to diligently follow the routine and practice Mindspark regularly.
